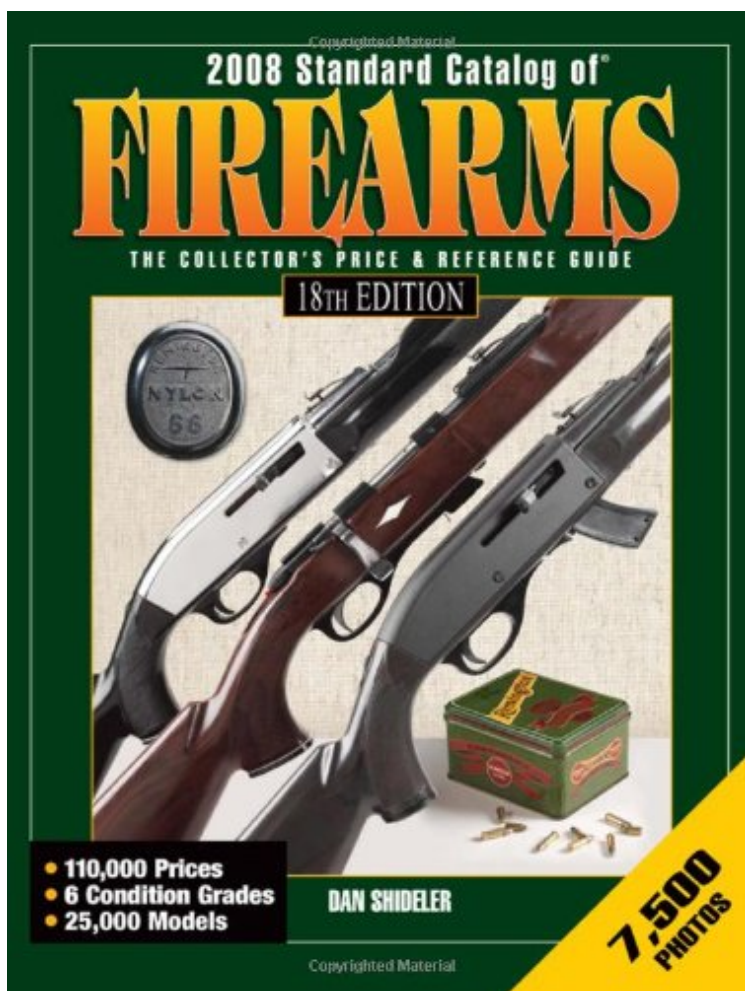

Fjestad; but Blue Book does not have photo's. If you are interested in firearms I recommend that you get Standard Catalog of Firearms once every 5 years and Fjestad's Blue Book every year. A few are not included in the book, but most are, along with pictures. I only buy one every two years because I buy a Blue Book in even years and the Standard Catalog in odd years. This lets me keep up with the value of most firearms all the time.
