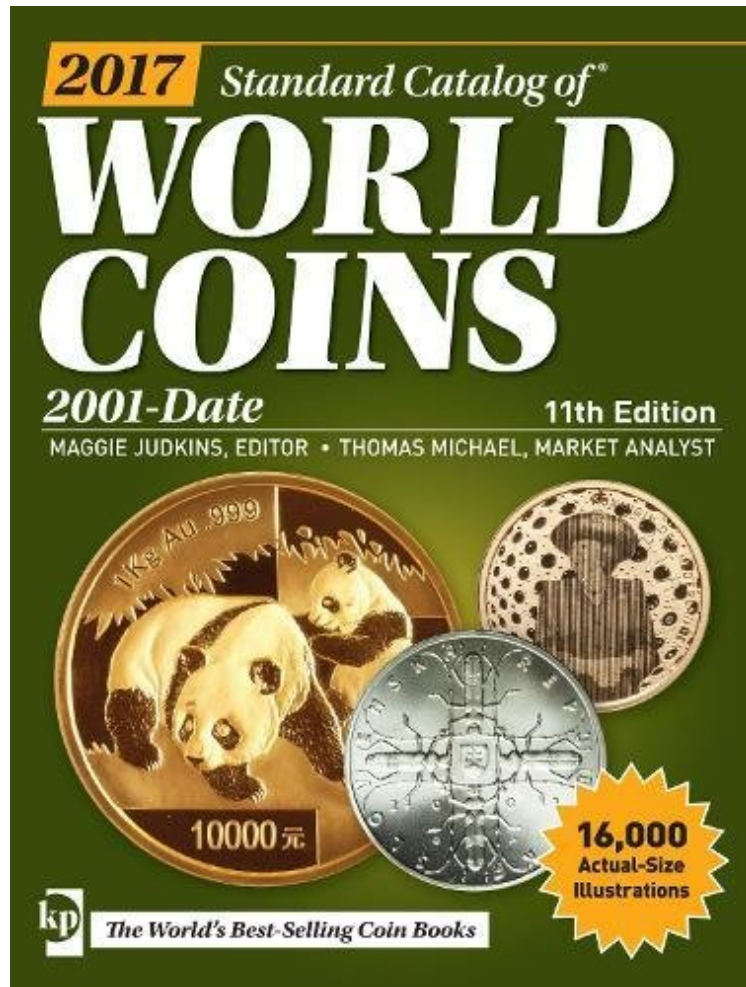

Sometimes it is but most mints/banks are more than happy to provide you with all the necessary data most of which is readily available on the Internet anyway. Apparently, the editors of the latest edition of SCofWC have not discovered the Internet yet because the 2017 edition fails miserably.

France? Up to 2014. India? 2012. Luxembourg? Early 2014. Mexico? 2014. Poland? Circulating issues - 2012, commemoratives - 2014. Who cares, anyway. Polish Mint (listed in the acknowledgments) did not bother to provide data? Did you ask? Russia? 2014. Singapore? 2013. Tunisia? 2011 (well, there is one coin from 2013). Ukraine? 2013.

United States? 2016 but if you are interested in US coins you have better and more specific catalogs anyway.
