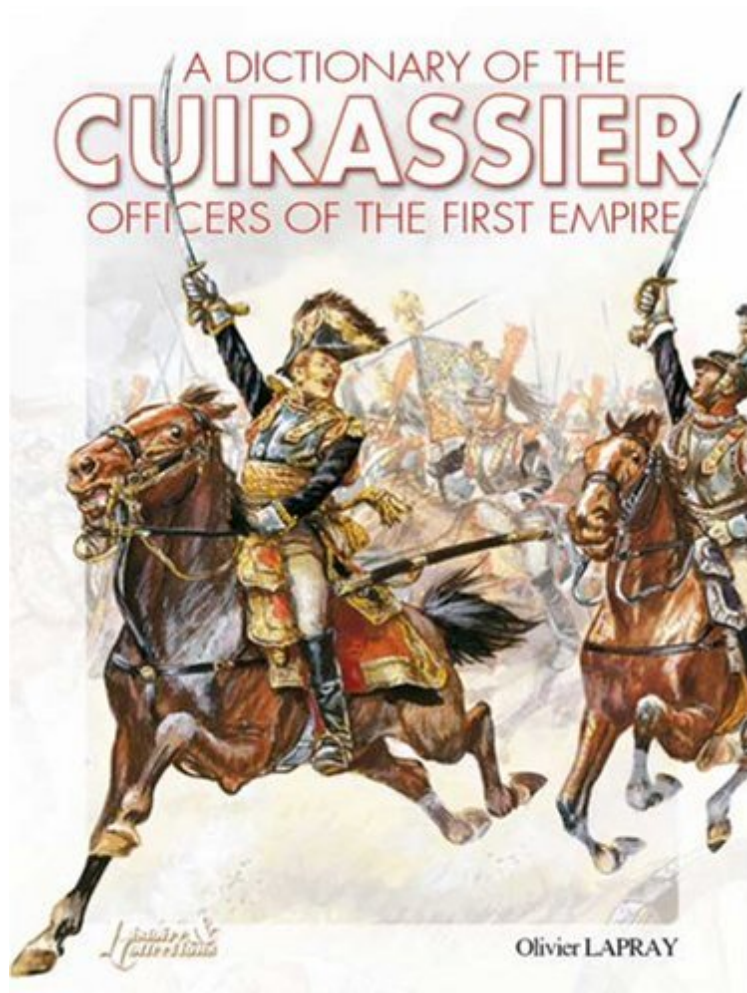

about the regimental distinctions and reproductions of many historical works of art by Rousselot, Meissonnier and others. Virtually every page contains something in the way of "eye candy". Plus you get all of the service record data regarding each officer A-Z and in many cases the coat of arms awarded when they were elevated into the nobility. There are also photos of orders and other documents signed by a number of the officers. The book is simply beautiful, exceedingly well organized, printed on heavy glossy paper and an absolute steal for the price. Every serious student of the period really has to have one of these books in his/her library.
