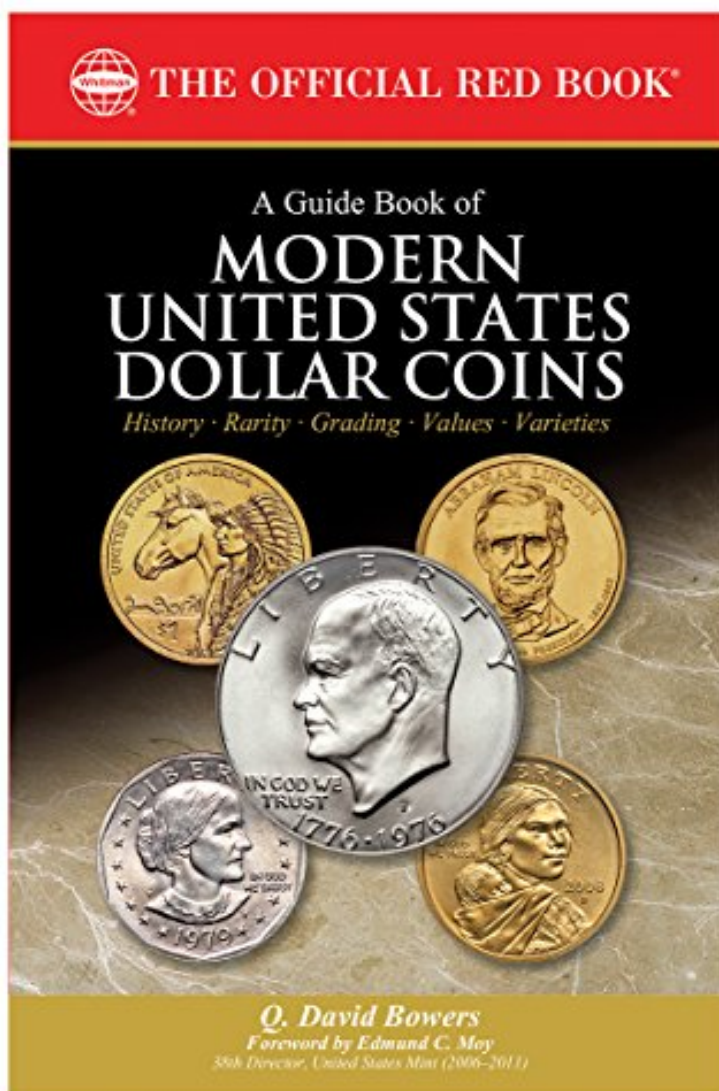

If you want the details regarding Ike varieties, adding "Collectible Ike Varieties" (499 to 599 pages depending on the version) by the Ike group (of which the late great Herb Hicks was a contributing member Ikus Emeritus) to your library is essential.
