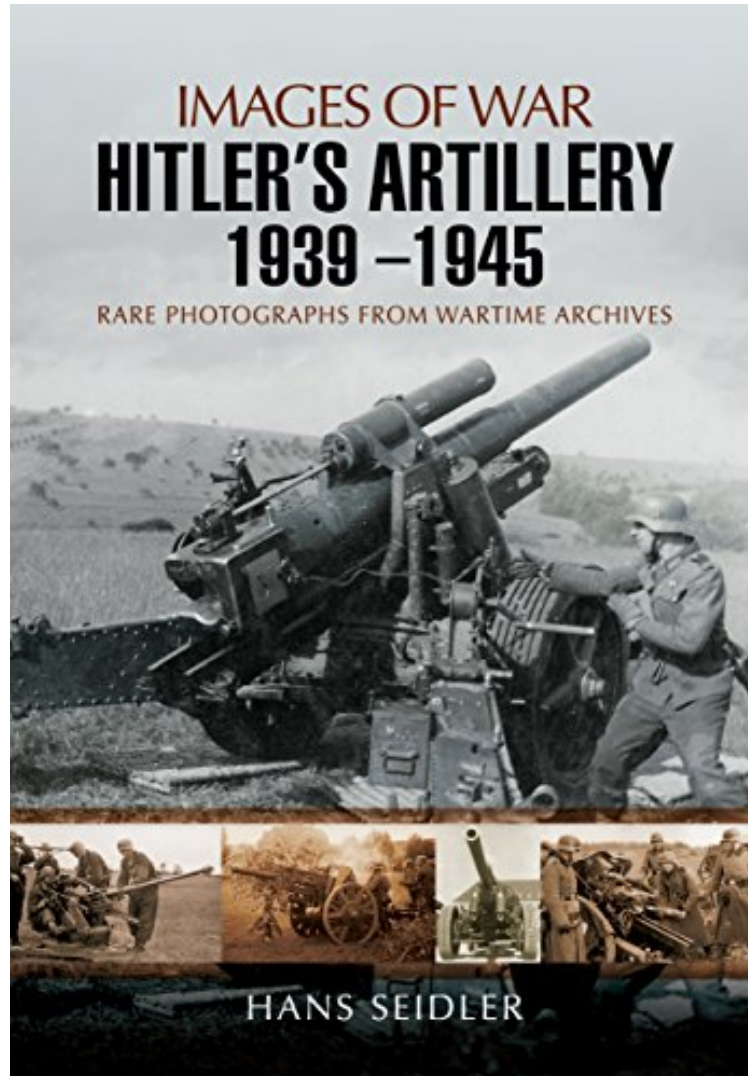

Not a serious work on the subjectBy CustomerOf course, the efforts of the author should be appreciated.That said, apart from having perhaps 30 pages worth (at the very most) of good pictures, there is little of value in this work. Perhaps what struck me the most was the number of times a weapon has been mislabeled (e.g. a 4cm bofors gun being mislabeled as a 5cm German flak gun). Further, what text there is is extremely broad, and not always accurate. In addition, only the most basic types of german field, anti-tank, and anti-aircraft artillery are covered (remember that the German used well over 200 different types of artillery (when you count captured weapons put into German service) and this book only covers about 15 at the most). Finally, most the

photos are really nothing special and what value they have has been lost by the by and large extremely broad captions used to describe them.

Hitlers Artillery 1939 1945 is a highly illustrated record of the firepower of the German war machine between 1939 1945. Many of the photographs, all from the authors collection, come originally from the albums of individuals who took part in the war. The images and text cover the guns in service with the Wehrmacht and Waffen-SS and provide a unique visual record of artillery pieces. These include the 7.5cm 1.IG18, the 10.5cm infantry gun, the powerful 15cm field howitzer, heavy 18cm and 21cm mortars and others including captured French, British and Russian guns. These and other weapons are seen in action in Poland, the Low Countries, France, Balkans, North Africa, Italy and, of course, Russia. Initially a key part of the Blitzkrieg offensive concept. The emphasis became defensive as the tide turned against the Germans. Using over 250 rare and unpublished photographs together with detailed captions and accompanying text, this book provides a unique insight into German weaponry from early Blitzkrieg campaigns to the final demise of the Nazi empire.
