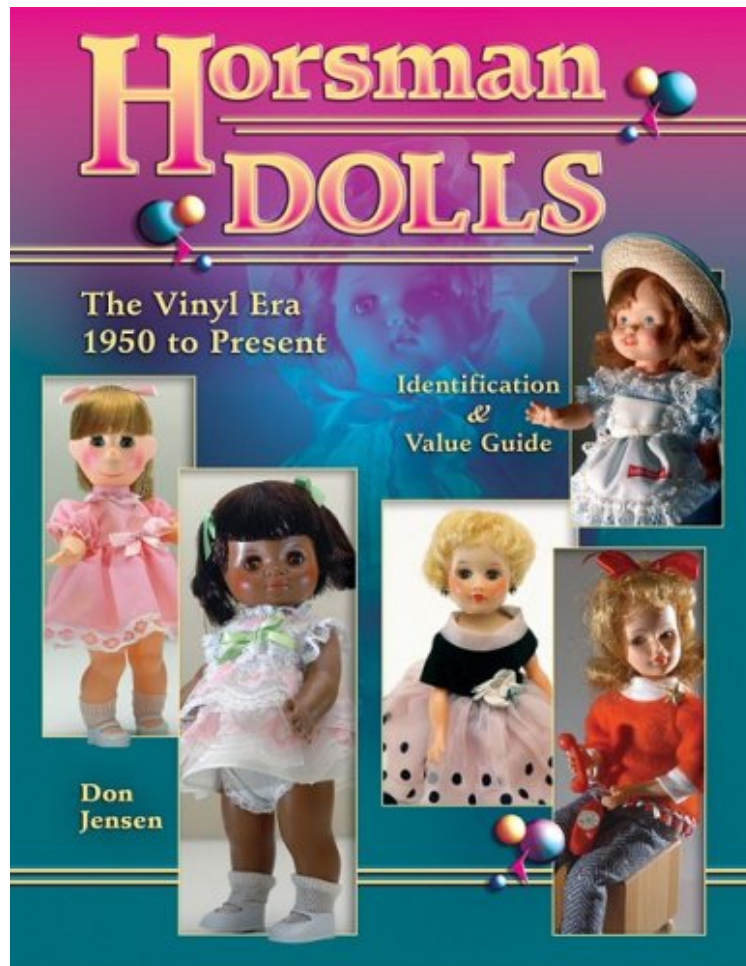

Almost all of the photos are of the actual dolls in mint condition. It lists a brief history of Horseman dolls, mold numbers and different characteristics to identify your doll. It discusses the different materials use to make the dolls, and includes pictures of the doll's insides. There is also a list of approximate value of the dolls. The dolls are listed in alphabetical order for the most part, with the year they were made. Sometimes if the doll is related to another doll it will be listed on the same page. Dolls that aren't related but have the same name are listed on the same page. On each page a brief history is given about one of the dolls on the page(not all).There is an index which is very helpful if you know the dolls name. Even though the book is in alphabetical order, sometimes it is difficult to find the doll.At first, I was a little disappointed that the dolls weren't

listed by year. I think it would be a little easier to find a doll that you didn't know the name. However if you have a doll like Mary Poppins, you can easily compare the difference between the 1964 and the 1973 version. Don Jensen, known as the Horsman expert, has lots of good information in this book. However, I found it harder to use to identify dolls. The dolls are listed in alphabetical order. Great if you know the doll's name, but not much help when you are trying to identify the doll you have. I prefer break downs by era, type of doll, or material type. Putting them all in A-Z order makes for a slow process if you don't already know the doll's name.
