

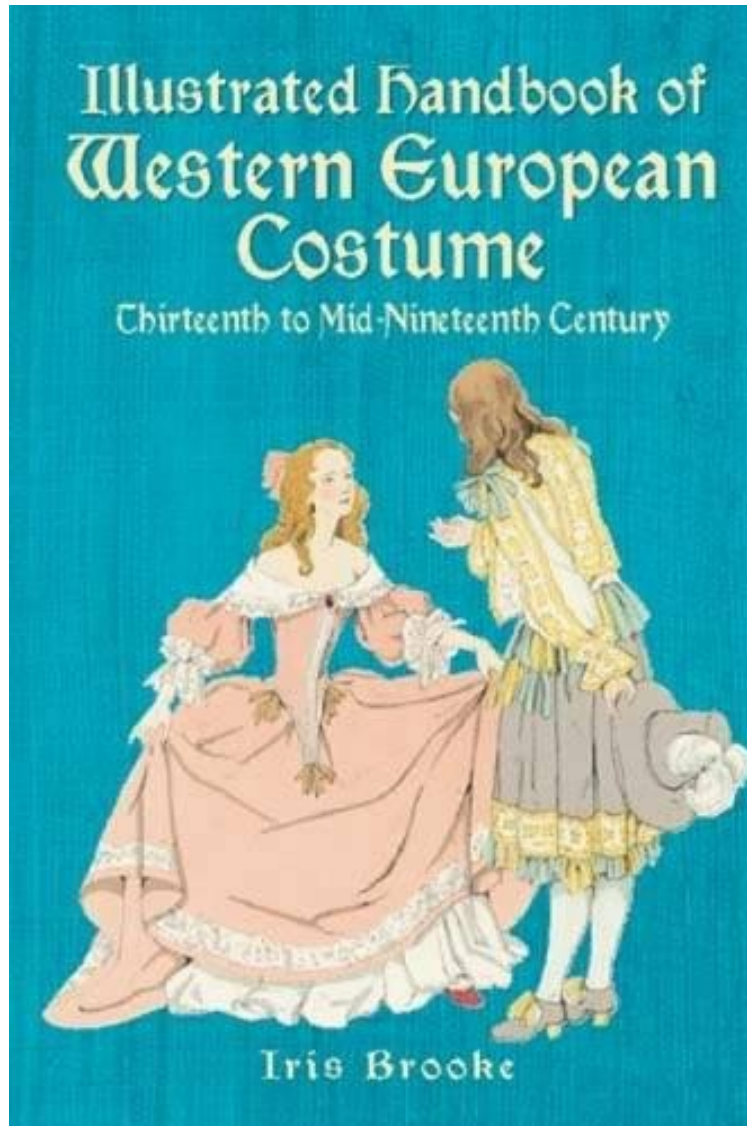

book was put together as a reference book for theatre and movie costume designers, but I bought it primarily because I love reading historical novels, many of them set in Western Europe. I'm always so intrigued by the costumes that the writers describe in intricate detail but I'm not always able to picture them in my mind's eye. I was expecting the book to be a simple catalogue of costumes of different countries arranged in chronological order, but I got more than I bargained for. The annotations include an explanation of where and when a particular costume first came in vogue and who originated them when there is historical evidence available. It also traces the succession of countries where the fashion later spread, citing sometimes how it travelled and how long it took. It was serendipitous that I bought this costume handbook at about the same time I began reading "Becoming Josephine" about Napoleon's Empress Josephine. In the novel, Josephine worries about how her clothes, fashionable in her Caribbean birthplace Martinique, were long outdated in Paris society. But with great aplomb, she manages to impress men in power with her "refreshing" and unencumbered "new" look. That this scholarly handbook of costumes confirms the fashion dynamics described in "Becoming Josephine" added another dimension to my enjoyment of the historical novel. I am now hoping that the authors of this handbook would release other volumes to accompany me as I read more historical novels covering other parts of the world, including ancient Egypt, Greece and Rome and the great countries of Asia and the Middle East.
