The text on each toy type is a little brief which is a pity because it appears to have been written by an academic who probably has more knowledge up her sleeve. The introduction poses the question of what actually constitutes a toy, which is rather interesting in this cultural respect. On the whole a nice general overview. The book has an expensive luxury silk inner cover binding, but it falls down on photos of mediocre quality. Having said that, with nothing else like it on the (western) market it has helped fill gaps in my knowledge, It's given names and meanings to toy/talismans that I had misinterpreted as a Westener (eg. its a Bullfinch not an Owl) and on the whole worthwhile to the collector of Mingei or traditional folk toys. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
