

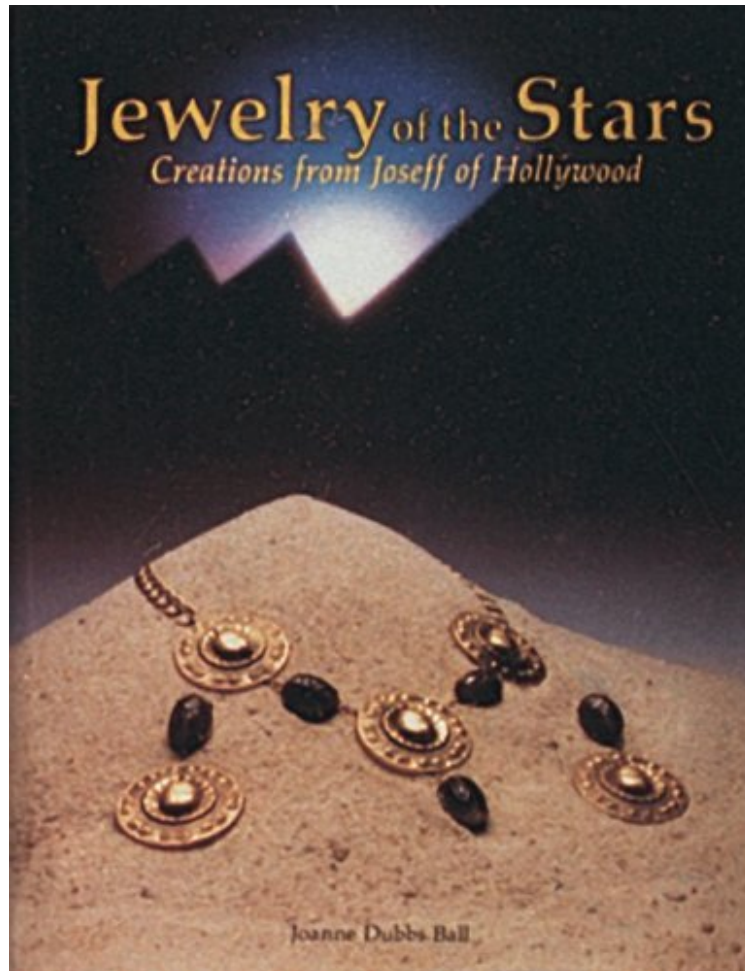

Also, it doesn't appear that a professional photographer was hired to capture the jewels. Many of the photos are dark and poorly lit, causing the details to be lost in shadow.
