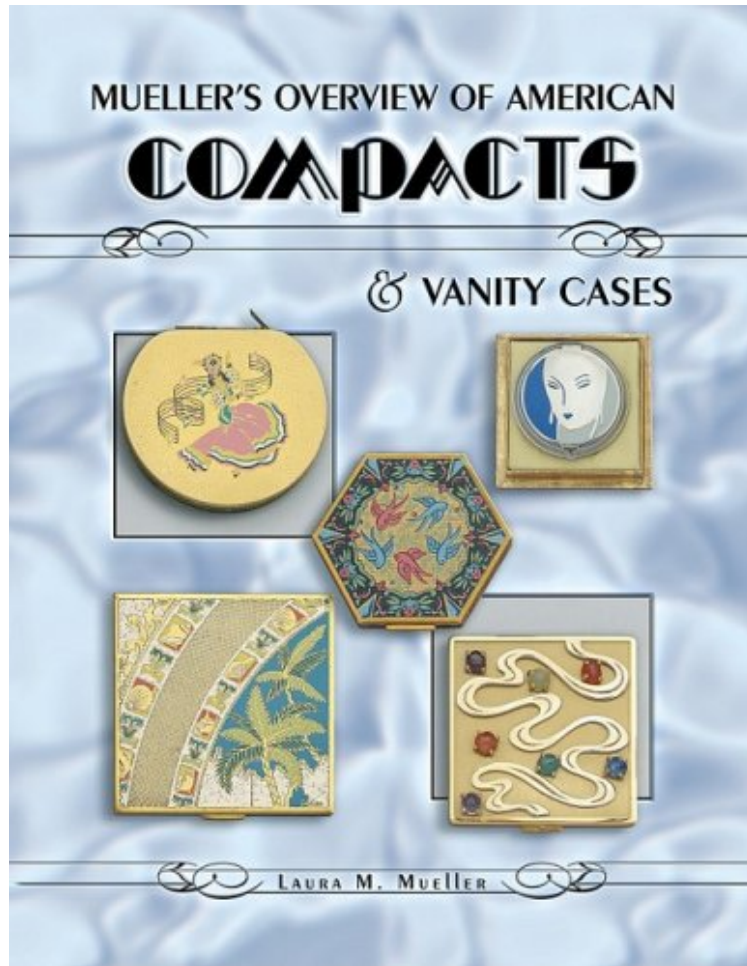


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Mueller's Overview of American Compacts Vanity Cases

Mueller from her splendid 2 volume work, Collector's Encyclopedia of Compacts, Carryalls Face Powder Boxes: Identification Values. In this great new book, she focuses primarily on powder compacts of American design and manufacture, with a few pieces from Europe added into the mix. The book is filled with full-color photographs of exquisite powder compacts, many of which are quite rare and sought after. There are also reproductions of print ads for some of the powder compacts pictured in the book. One thing that isn't in the book is prices and values for the compacts, which I think is an excellent decision, as values will only cause a book to be quickly dated. She also includes fascinating discussions of the histories of the designers and companies that produced

these tiny works of art. One that I found particularly interesting was the circumstances surrounding the creation of Dali's "Bird In Hand" compact. There are also a few patent drawings for various compacts, which are always fun to look at. This is an in-depth look at American powder compacts during their heyday of production and sales. I have spent hours going through it and drooling over the gorgeous, cute, and rare items that are contained within. Laura M. Mueller, author of two volumes of the Collector's Encyclopedia of Compacts, Carryalls Face Powder Boxes, is back with a new title. Though written on the same subject as her previous books, this new book is unique. It is largely an overview of American compacts, with just a few European examples for interest, accented with museum pieces and backed by years of research. Readers will learn about Richard Gaige and his works, Rex, and collections of Volupt, as well as pieces that are real 'knockouts,' items that reflect what most people think of when they think of American compacts. The idea for this volume began with a Volupt compact from the Richard Gaige family, and the book presents the definitive biography of Gaige, the major designer for Volupt. Descriptions, sizes, and pertinent facts about every compact showcased are presented, and there are more than 200 dazzling full-color photographs. 2008 values.

Hundreds of compacts, as well as some of the advertising, patent drawings and more, are pictured in the book. A compact is defined as a small cosmetic case containing only face powder and a mirror; a vanity case, sometimes called a double compact, also contained rouge. There were other variations. A triple case added a place for lipstick. A combination case might contain a coin holder or a place for a comb. Whatever style a woman chose, or was given as a gift, it was an important fashion access. About the Author Laura Mueller is a third generation of family authors, editors, and biographers.
